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President's Message

In the 2020-2021 academic year, the COVID-19 pandemic led us to transition quickly to online instruction and ultimately to suspend athletic competitions. This meant we had to put on hold temporarily many of the in-person campus experiences and activities that we know are integral to the Elmira College experience. Yet I'm proud of the campus's agility in these adverse times and grateful for every minute we can celebrate together.

The pandemic compounded the longer-term issues we face with a changing college landscape that has private higher education competing fiercely over a smaller pool of prospective students. It is clear that the future of higher education belongs to the institutions that can adapt and distinguish themselves.

Fortunately, in the second year of our five-year strategic plan, we are seeing signs that we are on the right course and headed toward financial stability. Central to these plans are new and unique academic programs featured in this report. Each of these programs offers students the opportunity to develop core liberal arts competencies, professional skills, and hands-on experience. New recruitment strategies and institutional branding are positioning us for success, while prudent budget management has enabled the institution to contain costs without jeopardizing programs and services available to students.

The College boasts four new leaders who bring significant experience to the president's cabinet (see page 3). In combination with existing leadership, this team will provide the necessary expertise and grit to meet the challenges that lie ahead.

How do we know our plan is working? We're seeing a number of positive indicators including an increase in net tuition per student over last year and stronger gift revenues, which partially made up for losses in auxiliary services income due to the pandemic. For 2021-22, Elmira College expects to break even on operations, prior to non-operating revenues and expenditures and depreciation.

While these are positive signs, the College **must** increase the support it receives from individuals and foundations to achieve long-term sustainability. This is where you come in. This year's giving goal is on the financials page. The institution's ultimate success depends on the <u>support of alumni and friends</u> <u>like you</u>.

When I saw the excitement of the students arriving on campus this fall, it filled me with a sense of optimism about the future of this venerable college. I know that together we can help future generations find their place at Elmira College.





Business And Economics

The division celebrated many accomplishments including the launch of the Tommy Hilfiger Fashion Business School, the Healthcare Management program, Finance certification courses and <u>articulation agreements with Syracuse University Martin J. Whitman J. School of Management</u> and Corning Community College. This year's Business & Economics Professional Panel Series was attended by over 60 alumni and professionals. Communications Sciences and Disorders


The professional programs division worked alongside our student colleagues to create new and exciting learning opportunities for our student teachers and future SLPs and audiologists. Our students were engaged in providing therapy through tele-practice and teaching through various methods creating presentation opportunities at state and national conferences. One student recently completed co-authorship of a textbook with a faculty member.

Humanities

In May 2021, Hannah Hammond, assistant professor of Theatre, and thirty students spent five weeks constructing and rehearsing the musical "You're A Good Man Charlie Brown." Though briefly quarantined due to COVID exposure, the production persevered with a "show must go on" mentality. It was a magical performance and a triumphant return of live theatre to campus after more than a year.

Mathematics & Natural Sciences

Each year, the Obler Summer Research program enables undergraduate students to do research with EC faculty, participate in career-building and social activities, and present their work at a final symposium. In <u>June 2020</u>, seven students worked with Drs. Adam Giambrone and Joseph Kolacinski (Mathematics) and Dr. Amy Lyndaker (Biology) using virtual tools to investigate knot theory, voting theory, and computational genetics.

Nursing Program

During Winter 2021, senior nursing students participated in several COVID vaccine clinics contributing to the health and safety of our local community. In June 2021 the Simulation Center welcomed its newest family member, Pediatric Hal. Pediatric Hal is the latest in high fidelity simulation technology and will afford students much-needed pediatric simulation experience. Pediatric Hal was made possible through a generous donation.

Professional Programs

Our faculty members are committed to engaging students in meaningful experiences, including facilitating student research that culminates in presentations at education conferences. Covid-19 provided a unique opportunity for education majors to engage in an authentic form of research, exploring effective strategies for teaching remotely, in-class, and in hybrid models, and, therefore, demonstrating their resilience, creativity and commitment to the education profession.

Social Sciences

Notable projects in the social sciences this past year included an experiment on memory by James Blair '23 and Dr. Christopher Terry, associate professor of Psychology; a study on students' support-seeking behaviors by Victoria Dunham '21, Razeon Thomas '22, Victoria Henson '22, and Dr. Ping Zheng, assistant professor of Psychology; and a senior thesis on the impact of the Covid-19 pandemic on campus life by Anna Brewer '21 and Dr. Martha Easton, associate professor of Sociology.

Athletics News

The 2020-2021 sports season was marked by a number of challenges due to the COVID-19 pandemic. Most notably, all three sports seasons were condensed into a three-and-a-half-month window between February and May 2021, the majority of games were played without fans in the stands, and athletes and coaches followed a strict COVID-19 testing policy. Despite these challenges, our coaches, student-athletes and fans rose to the occasion with notable successes:

- The men's and women's ice hockey teams brought home the United Collegiate Hockey Conference (UCHC) Champion titles and 26 ice hockey members placed on UCHC All-Academic Teams
- The women's volleyball team earned a spot in the spring Empire 8
 Conference Tournament
- 10 teams earned Spring 2021 Empire 8 All-Academic Teams
- 85 student-athletes from 10 sports teams earned spots on the Spring 2021 Empire 8 Conference President's List
- Student-athletes and sports teams including Women's Ice Hockey, Softball, Women's Lacrosse, Baseball, Men's Basketball, Esports, and Men's Volleyball achieved Academic All-American's and Excellence awards from multiple associations such as the ACHA, AFCA, IWCLA, ABCA, NABC, ECAC, and UVC




FY 21-22 Revenue Budget

(Operating and Non-Operating Revenues)




FY 21-22 Expense Budget
